



Computer Aid For Scoring Earns Emmy

An Emmy Award for outstanding achievement in engineering development has been voted the Auricle Time Processor, a computer software program designed for composers and music editors in film and tv, by the board of governors of the Academy of TV Arts & Sciences.

Emmys will be presented to Ron and Richard Grant "for development of the Auricle Time Processor, a computer system that enables composers and music editors to score a program with speed and accuracy previously unattainable."

The Grants will receive the award at the 37th annual primetime Emmy Awards presentation banquet, mainly for creative arts categories, on Sept. 7 at the Beverly Hilton.

An Engineering Emmy, recommended by a blue ribbon panel of engineers, is to "an individual, a company or an organization for developments in engineering which are either so extensive an improvement on existing methods or so innovative in nature that they materially affect the transmission, recording or reception of tv."
